

Evaluation Reporting guidelines

Our Aim

This year, our District Governor Lion Gratien Fernando's goal is to make District 306B2 the best Lions district in the multiple.

Our goal as a District GST team is to elevate our district 306B2 to the top of the world in terms of service activities and to achieve the governor's goal.

Our ultimate goal is to serve 30,000,000 beneficiaries through our service projects.

This document's purpose is to provide guidelines for identifying service activities, types of service activities and calculating volunteer hours & people served.

Reporting method

Club officers, both administrative elements and service projects are to be reported via MYLION only.

What are elements to be reported in MYLION

- **1.** All Service project; If you are reporting in **other service category**, please specify the service category very clearly.
- **2.** All of your service activities to be numbered.
- 3. Clearly mention the People Served (beneficiaries), funds used in USD, and so on.
- **4.** Report your club board and monthly meeting
- 5. Report your club's fundraising projects and fund donation projects

What is service?

Lions and Leos serve in many ways, including:

Service Activities: Hands-on service activities, such as tree planting, vision screening, rebuilding homes after disaster strikes, educating people in our communities on the causes that impact them, or serving meals to those in need, etc.



Advocacy: Raising awareness of the causes that are important to Lions, often referred to as advocacy. Some examples include conducting walk for diabetes awareness or visiting a local authority to discuss the needs of the blind or visually impaired.

Donations: Making charitable donations to individuals or organizations, including Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). Funds donated to LCIF are tracked by the foundation and need not be reported as a service activity.

Fundraising: Raising funds to enable our service.

Meetings: Clubs may hold meetings for the purpose of planning service activities, recruiting new members, strengthening the club, educating, and training members, completing administrative tasks, and engaging in fellowship with other Lions.

These activities contribute to Lions' positive impact in various ways, including attracting new members to clubs, helping clubs retain members by providing a positive experience, preparing Lions to serve, or directly benefitting the people we serve.

How Lions and Leos Measure Their Service Impact

These are called metrics. Metrics allow all Lions around the world to report their service, and to see how local service adds up to make a huge global impact. The metrics used to measure success depend on the type of service.

District Governor's Special Service Areas

- Land Mark Projects
- > Agriculture (Home Gardening)
- > Self- Employment



> Women Empowerment

Metrics that are currently collected by Lions Clubs International

Number of Activities: Each activity reported by a club, district, or multiple district it is counted as one activity.

Number of People Served: These are the direct beneficiaries of Lions service. Sometimes the number of People Served can be counted precisely, and sometimes it must be estimated.

Number of Volunteers: The number of people who participate in the planning or implementation of a service project. As Lions often invite friends to join their service activities, the number of volunteers can include both Lions and non-Lions.

Number of Volunteer Hours: The number of hours spent planning and implementing a service project.

Funds Raised: The amount of money collected to fund service activities or charitable donations. This can be from Lions making personal contributions, or funds raised from non-Lions during a fundraising event.

Funds Donated: The amount of charitable funds given to an individual or organization. Funds donated to Lions Clubs International Foundation are tracked by the foundation and need not be reported as a service activity, but if an event was held to raise those funds, that event can be reported as a fundraising activity.

Depending on the type of service project, these metrics are either required or optional for service reporting. The table below provides an overview:

Guidelines for Calculating People Served

Determine if People Served is a required metric for your activity.

People Served is only required for service activities. There are many situations where a club, may want to report People Served in their service activities. The guidelines below show how to calculate the number of people served during club service activities.

- A fundraiserwhere the beneficiaries are known and present.
 Example: A club raises money to provide five school scholarships. If the students are present and receive their scholarships at the event, the club could report five beneficiaries.
- Donation of dry rations for example a club donate dry rations parcels for families in need, 1Kg of rice can serve 5 people.

Example: A club donate 10 dry ration parcels with 5Kg of rice in each, the club would report 250 beneficiaries. (10 Parcels x 5 Kg of rice x 5 people)



- Awareness programwhere club conduct any type of awareness program, the number of People Served is the number of people attended to the program.
 Example: A club conduct Diabetes awareness program in school &100 students participated the session. The club could report 100 beneficiaries under diabetes category.
- One time service activity one-time activityserves beneficiaries one time, and end when
 the project is completed. These activities can sometimes last more than one day,
 however they do not regularly repeat.
 Example: A club organize a diabetes screeningproject and screen 200 people; The club
 could report 200 beneficiaries under diabetes category.
- Recurring activities are those that regularly repeat, such as cleaning up a highway once a month. In this example, each individual highway cleanup can be reported as one activity. The number of motorists who use the highway on the day of each cleanup should be reported as the number of People Served for that activity. This category is applied for beach cleaning & other recurring activities.
- When reporting ongoing activities, first determine the most appropriate time frame for
 each service report. This may be monthly for a transport vehicle, annually for a school,
 or quarterly for a health clinic. Report the activity at the chosen interval, counting only
 the beneficiaries served during that time.
 - Example: A club built a building for school attending by 100 students each year could be reported once per year, with 100 beneficiaries reported each time.
- Multiple clubs serving together. Participating clubs should discuss and agree upon the
 approach in advance of service reporting. If one club initiated the project and did most
 of the planning, Lions may prefer that club report the activity. If all clubs participated
 about equally, Lions may prefer that each club report the activity. Club should ensure
 that metrics, such as People Served, are not reported multiple times.



- District or multiple district initiatives. Sometimes, a district or multiple districts will
 recommend that all clubs conduct a certain type of service in a given year.

 Example: A district governor might request that all clubs in their district focus on
 diabetes screenings. Clubs that conduct diabetes screenings should still report them as
 individual club activities.
- Activities that serve multiple causes. When reporting, select the primary cause served, or break the activity into multiple activities and report them separately.
 Example: If you are providing vision screening and diabetes screening at a health camp, you can report the vision and diabetes screenings as two separate activities.
- Conducting online awareness program. When Lions clubs organize an online program
 (via Zoom, Teams, Skype, Etc), the event organize club can report the number of
 participants as a people served, participants may report that they attended this event.
 Example: One club organize a health awareness program via Zoom, and 100 people
 attended. An organized club can report serving 100 people.
- **Distributing awareness leaflets via social media**. If the Lions club wishes to distribute awareness leaflets via social media and report people served, the following steps must be taken.
 - The Lion Logo and the District Governor's logo should appear on the leaflet
 - The name of the service committee should be printed on the leaflets
 - Leaflets should be distributed to at least three social media groups (Facebook, WhatsApp, Viber, Instagram, Twitter, etc)
 - Take a screenshot of the published media and report on it.
 - Club can report 3000 people served under selected category

Example: If a club distribute an awareness leaflet prepared by the district Vision team in three different Facebook groups, the club can report 3000 people served under Vision category.



Tree planting and care. Tree Planting and Tree Care are popular service activities
conducted by Lions and Leos, however determining the number of People Served from
these activities can be difficult. In the MyLion, all Lions can record the number of trees
planted or cared by the club in each project.

All tree planting and distribution projects should be reported in MyLion under the Environment category. The projects are evaluated by the district evaluation team in two sections as listed below.

- Activities related to the environment (Excluding tree planting)
- Planting of trees

The number of people served by tree planting and caring is calculated using international guidelines for how much oxygen a tree produces, how much oxygen a person consumes, and type of crops produce by the trees. The following sections will be considered for reporting tree planting & care category based on the above-mentioned criteria.

According to international standards, a mature plant is one that has reached the age of three years and above. These mature plants are producing the maximum amount of Oxygen and other crops for the benefit of the society. However, given motivation to Lions for promote tree planting activities, we consider all benefits can start from the beginning of the planting.



Forestry type plants (Eg. Teak, etc)-According to the calculations, the table below shows how many people can be served by a single tree by providing oxygen.

Height of the tree (From Ground Level)	No of people served by one tree
0 Ft to 4 Ft	118
Above 4 Ft	236

Example: If a club planter distribute 10teak plants, with the height of 2ft & 05 plants with the height of 4ft, the club can report 2360 people served under Environment category. (118x 10+ 236x5)

Forestry type plants (Eg. Kumbuk & Mee)- According to the calculations, the table below shows how many people can be served by a single tree by providing oxygen.

Height of the tree (From Ground Level)	No of people served by one tree
0 Ft to 4 Ft	236
Above 4 Ft	472

Mangrove plants(Eg. Kadolana plants)-According to the calculations, a single tree can feed 472 people by providing oxygen.

Example: If a club plantor distribute5Kadolana plants, the club can report 2360 people served under Environment category.



- Crops plants-Coconut plants- A single Coconut tree can feed 1000 people by providing oxygen & it's crops.
 - Example: If a club plant or distribute3 Coconut trees, the club can report 3000 people served under Environment category.
- Crops plants— Jack trees- A single Jack tree can feed 800 people by providing oxygen& it's crops.
 - Example: If a club plant or distribute 3 Jack trees, the club can report 2400 people served under Environment category.
- Crops plants All other fruits plants & Ayurvedic medicine plants A single any type of fruit trees & Ayurvedic medicine plants can feed 500 people by providing oxygen & it's crops.
 - Example: If a club plant or distribute 5 Mango plants, the club can report 2500 people served under Environment category.
- Meetings, Clubs can report all their meetings in this category. This includes, monthly
 club meetings, monthly director board meetings, meetings with local authorities
 regarding Lion's service activities, club installation, attending club school, any district &
 multiple district meeting, & all meeting related to Lion's activities.
- Maximum people served cap, Lions Clubs International has introduced a cap of 3000
 people served on individual service activity reported through MyLion. Therefore, club
 can allocate a maximum of 3000 people served to any single service activity.
- Currency type for reporting service activities, all clubs should report all donations and fundraising activities under service category in USD. The exchange rate from Sri Lankan Rupees to USD is 200.00. This exchange rate is valid between 1st July 2021 and 31st
 December 2021. We will notify all in due course of the revised exchange rate for the period of 1st January 2022 to 30th June 2022, based on market rates.



This reporting guidelines to ensure that service reporting is accurate and consistent. However, Lions and Leos are the true experts in their service, and as such should rely on their own experience when measuring service impact.
